New Path Youth and Family Services 2023-2024



Circle of Security Indigenous Partnership

We are partnering with Dnaagdawenmag Binnoojiiayag Child & Family Services to support training Family Support Workers in delivering a modified Circle of Security program. This program teaches First Nations, Inuit, Metis (FNIM) parents/caregivers how to identify and respond to and meet the attachment needs of children at different stages.

Simcoe Muskoka Regional Eating Disorder Program

We are proud to be collaborating with Royal Victoria Regional Health Centre (RVH) and Orillia Soldiers Memorial Hospital (ISMH), supporting the Simcoe Muskoka Regional Eating Disorders Program (SMREDP) in expanding services via a stepped care approach as well as pre and post treatment to address the pressing need in our community.

Evidence-Based Practice and Training

Our Evidence Based Practice Committee has worked diligently to revise processes that ensure ongoing training for our staff, fostering a culture of continuous learning and professional development.

HEADS-ED Screening Tool

To enhance our administrative processes and streamline daily operations we implemented the HEADS-ED Screening Tool in our intake department. This tool is designed to efficiently identify mental health and addiction needs across a broad age range, from early infancy to transitional-aged youth.

Increased Access to EarlyON Child and Family Centre Drop In Programs

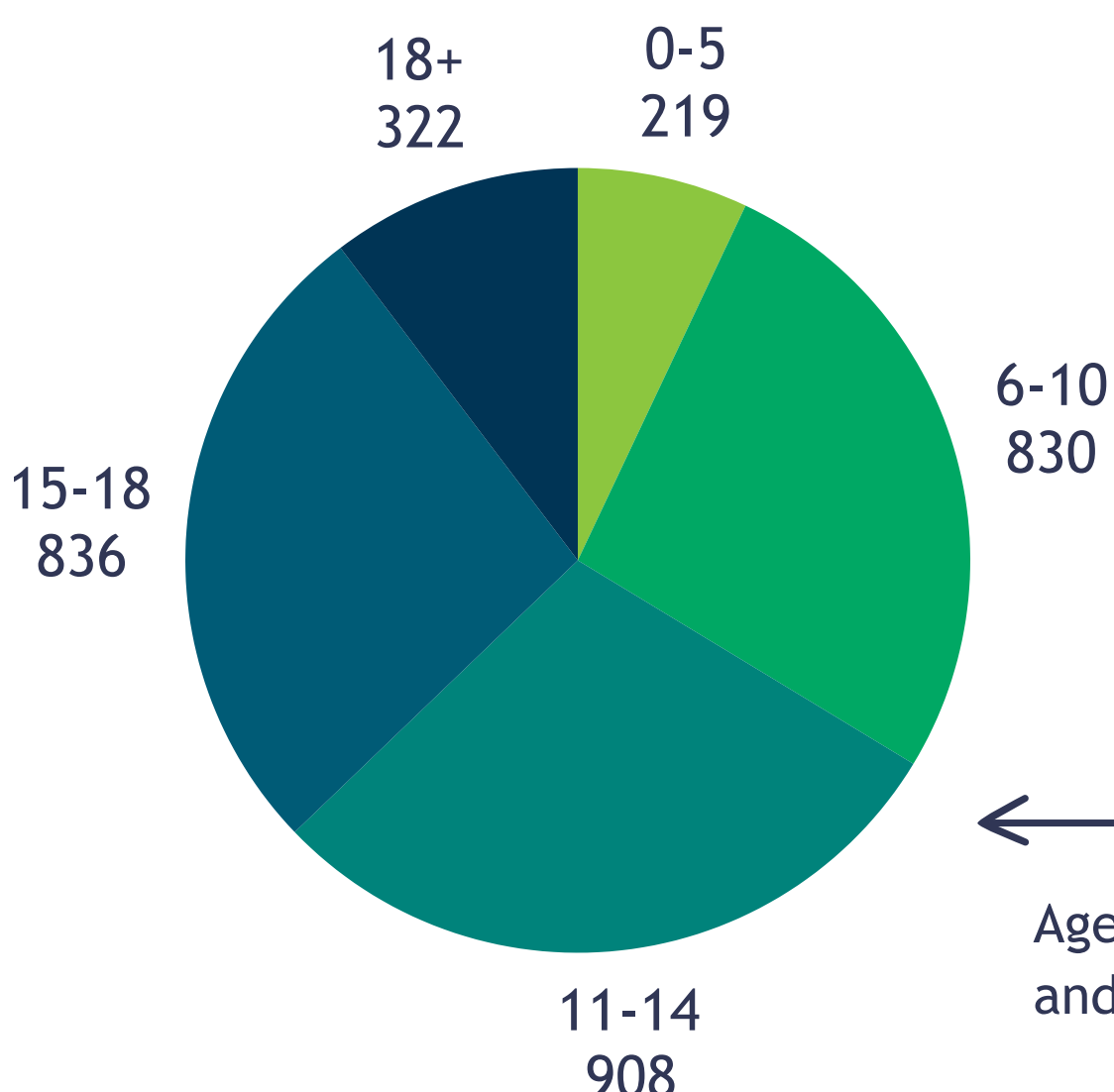
Our Early Years' team has enhanced existing mental health resources and capacity building strategies to support children, families and the workforce in early years in underserved areas.

Ocean E-Referral Digital Referral Pathway

We launched this digital referral pathway to provide a streamlined process for primary care to make referrals to our services, and joining our Ontario Health Team Partners and Central Ontario Specialized Health Network on 1door.ca as part of a coordinated access initiative.

3115 CHILDREN AND YOUTH, THEIR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS SUPPORTED

More than half (57%) of the children and youth who received services had complex needs, meaning they had more than one priority need requiring multiple services.



Ages of children and youth, their families and caregivers supported at New Path.

- The top three reasons for seeking counselling support in 2023/2024 were: emotional, behavioural, and family needs
- 99% of youth and parents/caregivers reported being satisfied with the help they received through the services at New Path
- 92% of children and youth had a positive perception of the service system
